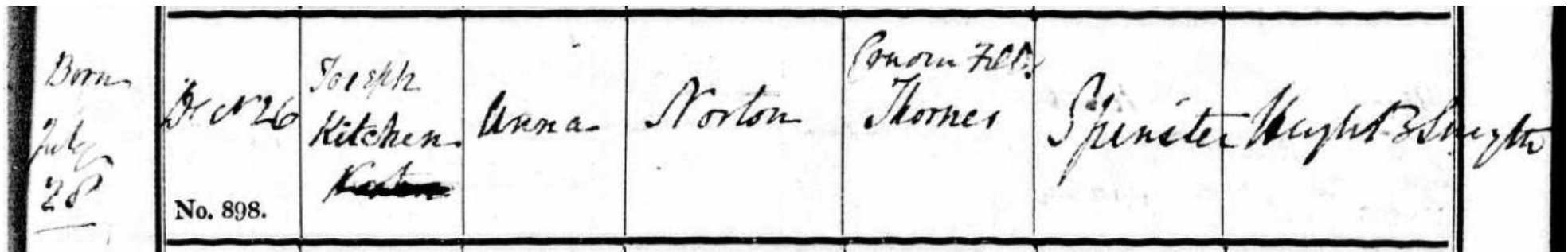

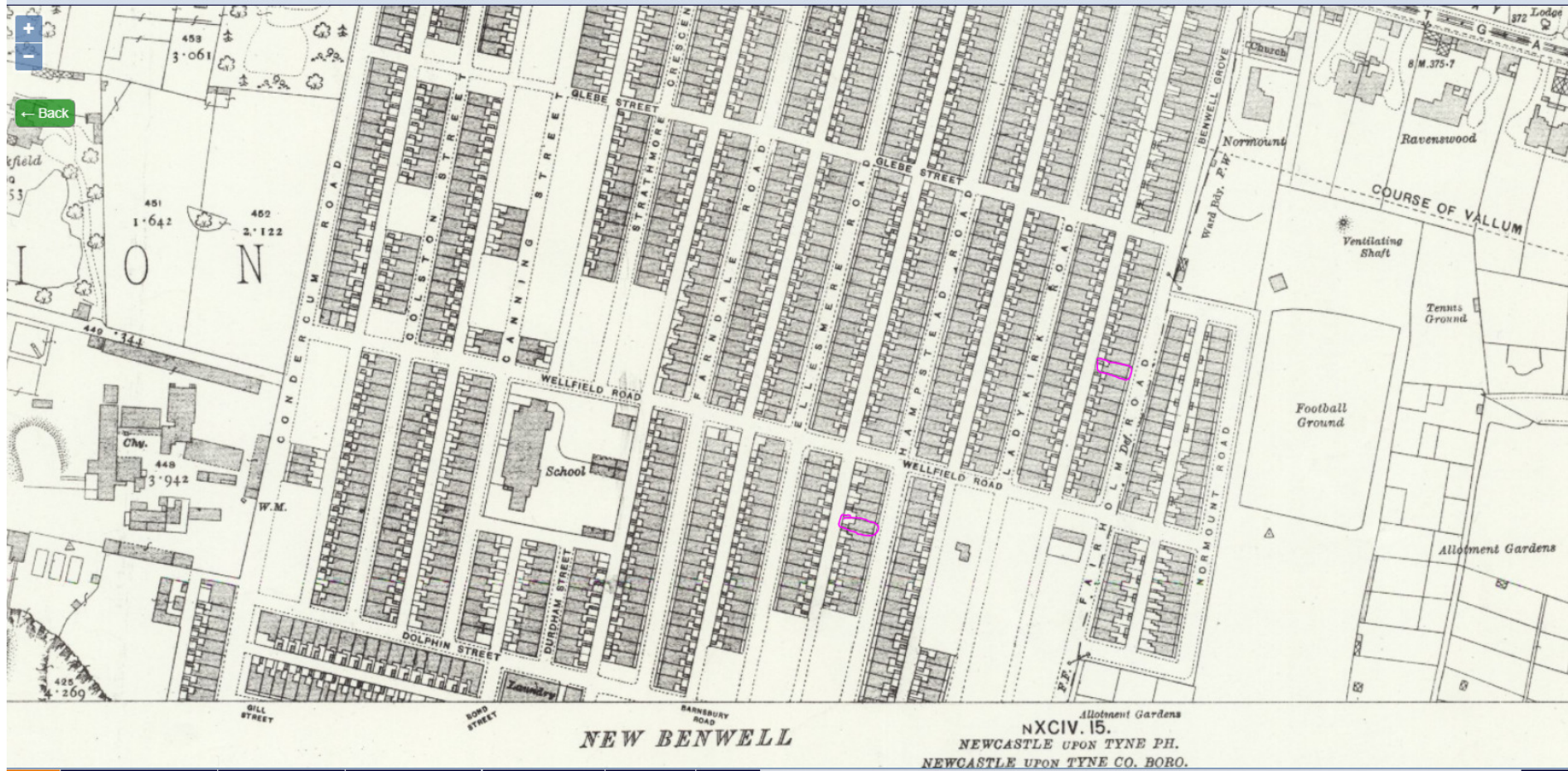

Joseph Kitchen Norton in 1911. No 131, Fairholm Road. Has it been amalgamated with 129, Fairholme Road?



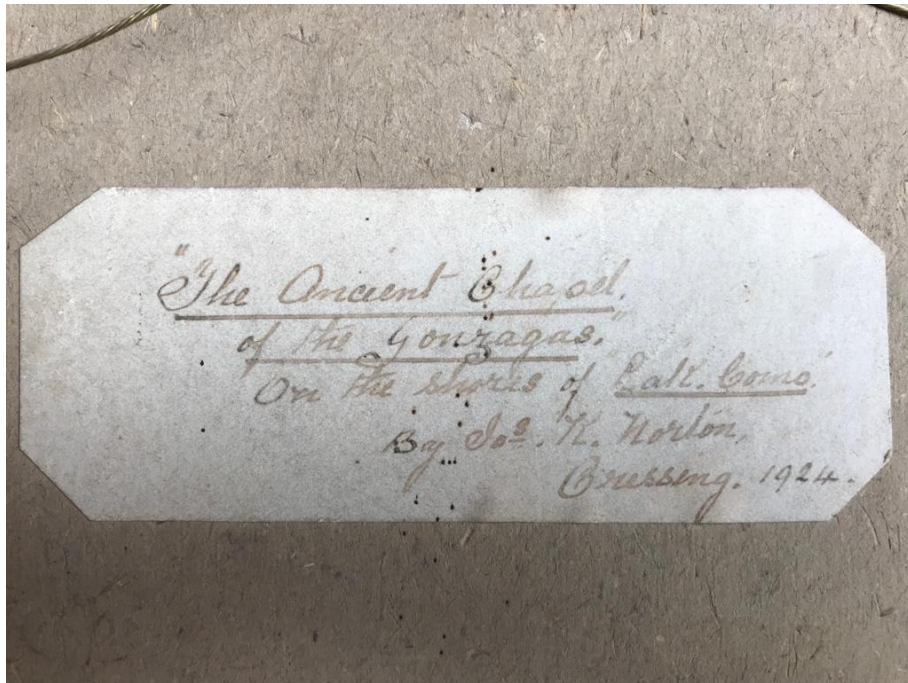

Goodness – he seems to have retired to Cressing! In 1901, his daughter, Ada, had married the aptly named George Harry Bishop (baptised 19 Dec 1875 in Malinslee, Shropshire. Died 1955) who became vicar of Cressing! But where was Ada in 1921? Ethel Norton had married William Joseph Purchase, also absent.

CRESSING WEDDING.

MISS E. W. MOSS AND MR. H. C. PETTET.

A pretty wedding took place on Tuesday at All Saints' Church, Cressing, when Mr. Henry Charles Pettet, only child of Mr. and Mrs. C. W. Pettet, Maidstone, was married to Miss Eunice Winifred Moss, second daughter of Mrs. L. E. Moss and the late Mr. Mark Moss, Rook Hall, Cressing. This was the first wedding solemnised from Rook Hall for many years, and it attracted a good deal of interest. The bride, who was given away by her uncle, Mr. Harry Birkin, home at Tiptree on holiday from Australia, wore a dress of ivory charmeuse, with a square silk lace train suspended from the shoulders; her veil was of Tambour lace, with wreath of orange blossom, and she carried a bouquet of pink and white roses, a gift from the bridegroom. Her ornaments included a gold and ivory pendant, a souvenir from Switzerland. There were two bridesmaids, Miss Olive G. Moss, sister of the bride, who wore mauve georgette and charmeuse, with silver lace cap, and a gold slave bangle, a gift from the bridegroom; and Miss Mary Dyer, Braintree, cousin of the bride, dressed in cream net and lace, with pink and mauve piping, and a pink veil; her gold pendant was a gift from the bridegroom; they also carried bouquets of mauve sweet peas. The bride's mother wore a gown of black georgette, heavily trimmed with oriental-coloured beads, and a black hat with an orange plume to tone with the beads, and carried a bouquet of red carnations, a gift from the bridegroom and his father. Mr. W. N. Sutcliffe, Maidenhead, was best man.

The church was filled, and the service was choral. The hymn, "The Voice that breathed o'er Eden," was sung, and the organist, Mr. Hubert Adams, played Mendelssohn's "Wedding March." A reception followed at Rook Hall, where nearly 50 guests had breakfast. Later the bride and bridegroom motored to Colchester Hospital, where they visited the bride's brother, Mr. Stanley Moss, who is a patient there with a broken arm and other injuries sustained in a motor cycle accident. The bride left her wedding bouquet in the ward. In the evening, the newly-married couple caught the Harwich boat for Belgium, en route for Switzerland, where the honeymoon is being spent. The bride travelled in a navy blue costume, with black Tegel hat, and a fur tie, a gift from the bridegroom. Among the many presents were a cut-glass bowl and water jug from the staff at Boots, Maidenhead. The bride's mother and sister upon leaving the Parish Church placed their bouquets upon the grave of Master Clive Moss, the Chelmsford Grammar School boy who was drowned at Clacton last summer while trying to save his sister.

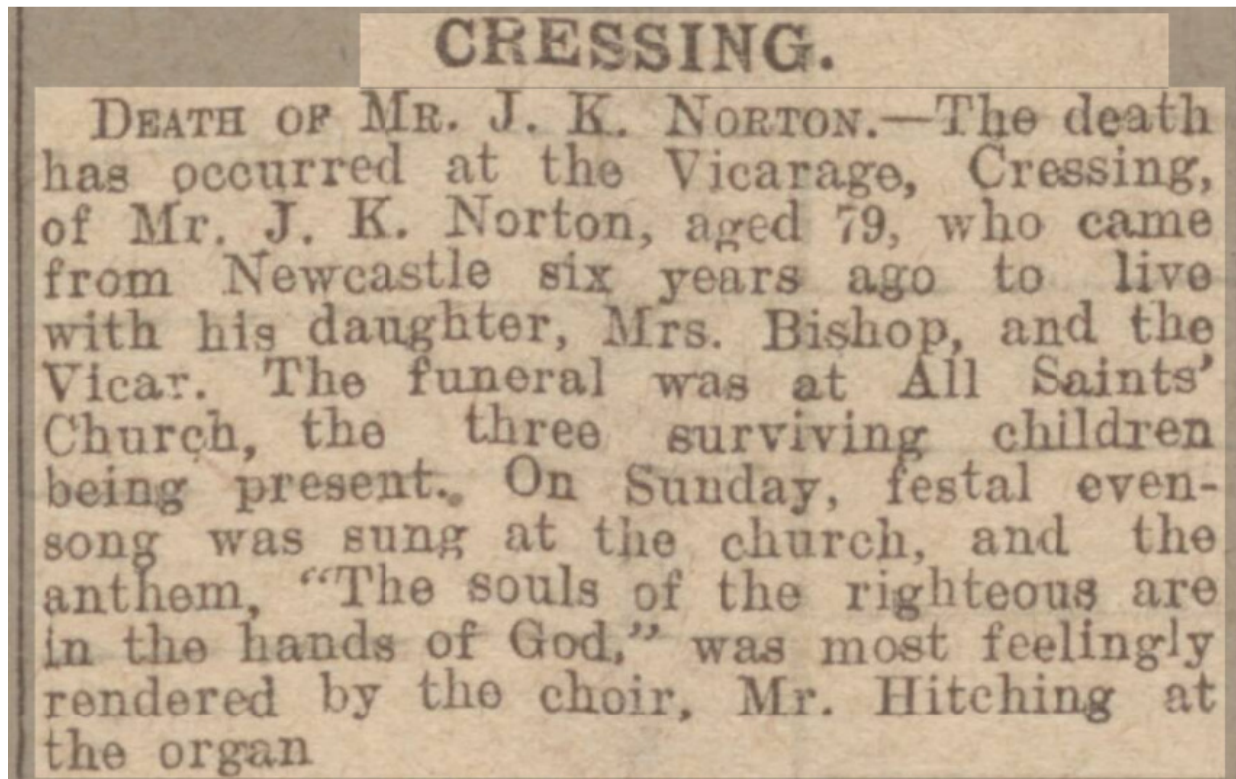

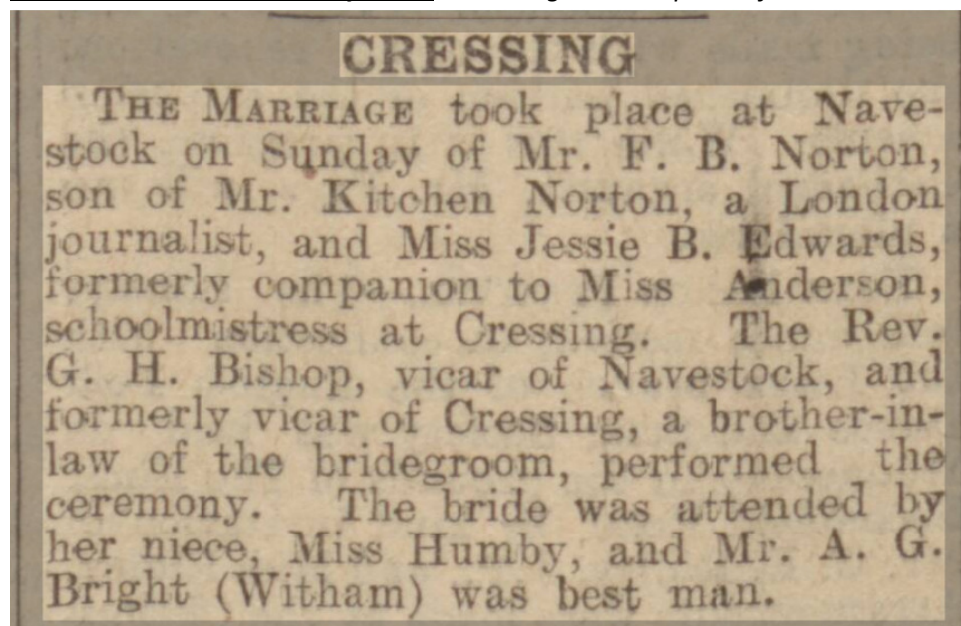
CRESSING

PRESENTATION. -- The Rev. G. H. Bishop (vicar of the parish for the past 12½ years), and Mrs Bishop, have been presented with a leather case containing bank notes, on the occasion of their leaving Cressing for Navestock. This was subscribed for by the parishioners and friends, as a token of grateful appreciation of their ministration and work; and was presented by Mr. Butler, the people's warden.

THE REV. D. F. BARRETT-LENNARD.

On Monday the institution took place at Cressing Parish Church of the Rev. D. F. Barrett-Lennard, B.A., to the living of Cressing, in succession to the Rev. G. H. Bishop, appointed to Navestock. The Bishop of Chelmsford performed the institution in the presence of a large congregation, and the Bishop of Colchester, as Archdeacon, inducted the new Vicar to the temporalities. The clergy present in addition to those named were Canon Galpin, Faulkbourne; the Rev. C. Hutchinson, Rayne; the Rev. A. W. Goodhart, White Notley; the Rev. F. Davies, Bradwell; and the Rev. F. T. Gardner, Goldhanger (where the new Vicar has been curate).

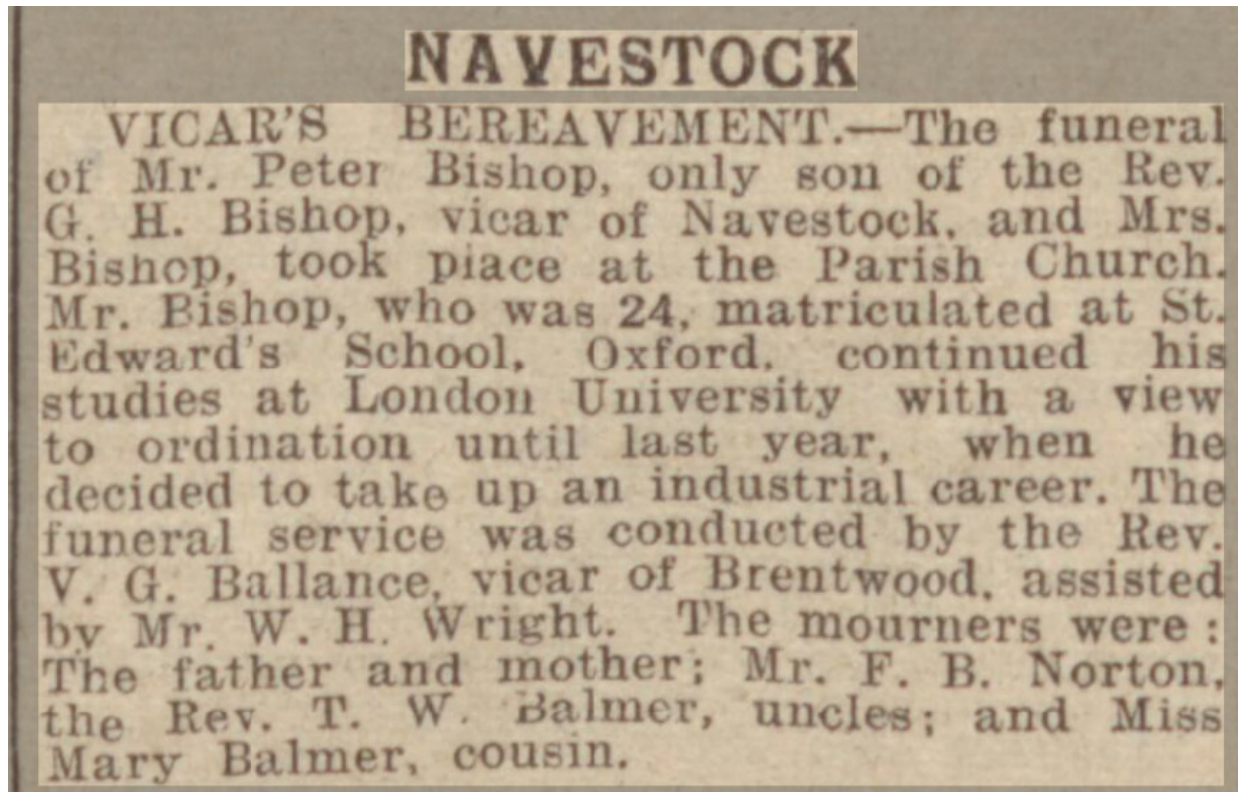


